### **Food Security Cluster**



The Food Security Cluster (FSC) was established to design, monitor, prepare and coordinate response during a humanitarian crisis with the support of partners, addressing issues of food availability, access, utilization and stability.

### What we do

The FSC coordinates country-level food security response plans during humanitarian crises by:

- Ensuring there are no gaps or duplications in the response.
- Providing food security information to all partners.
- Facilitating partners in the preparation of countrylevel Humanitarian Needs Overviews (HNO) and Humanitarian Response Plans (HRP).
- Providing necessary information to the lead agencies to be appropriately represented at the HCT.

### **Our Priorities**

The FSC ensures a high and consistent level of response, identifying gaps and addressing them with partners and specialists, thanks to enhanced coordination of:

- Information management, including: response dashboard, mapping, situation reports.
- · Capacity development.
- Communication and advocacy.
- Guidance.

# Support from HQ

The global FSC is led by two co-coordinators and a support team, designated by the cluster lead agencies FAO and WFP, who provide guidance to country-level FSC operations. The global FSC has also established a Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) to ensure transparency and inclusion: it is composed of a representative selection of all FSC partners, including four INGOs, the two gFSC co-coordinators and one member of each cluster lead agency.

The SAG is composed by 8 members: 4 INGOs (Plan International, Solidarités International, Concern Worldwide, Welthungerhilfe), 2 global coordinators (from FAO and WFP) and 2 members of the respective Cluster Lead Agencies.

Additionally, the Food Security Cluster closely collaborates with other global clusters (eg. Nutrition, WASH and Health) at national, regional and global level to support joint programming and advocacy initiatives, and collectively raise the alarm on the state of food security.

At global level, 3 workings groups are active: Agriculture, Cash and Market and Protection, to provide lessons learnt, best practices and technical guidelines.
